Key Scripture: Genesis 22:1-2, 13, “¹ After these things God tested Abraham and said to him, “Abraham!” “Here I am,” he answered. ² “Take your son,” he said, “your only son Isaac, whom you love, go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains I will tell you about.” “¹³ Abraham looked up and saw a ram caught in the thicket by its horns. So Abraham went and took the ram and offered it as a burnt offering in place of his”

Engage

Have you ever done a trust fall? Have you ever witnessed a trust fall gone wrong? In those moments you have to believe the people around you will catch you. Apply
